



8. An adult coach will accompany each squad to all activities during the clinic. Camp managers will help with dorm responsibilities, first aid, and other problems; however, adult coaches are still in charge of and responsible for their squad at all times. Huntingdon College staff does a dorm walk through before and after clinics. Any damage to rooms will be **charged to the squad assigned to that room**. There is also a charge for every bed/mattress moved without permission. Each school will be responsible for filling out a room inventory form on the first day of camp and turning it in to AISA. You may wish to take pictures of any room problems and attach to the inventory form.
9. Each school is responsible for all health insurance coverage. The AISA, UCA, and Huntingdon College will not assume responsibility regarding injuries, etc. incurred during clinic week.
10. Each girl will bring her own towels, bed linens, pillow, and any other personal items needed. Bring comfortable practice clothes and tennis shoes. Pompons, megaphones, notebooks and pencils will be helpful. Huntingdon College does not allow signs on the walls of gym and lobby.
11. **AISA All-Star Tryouts** will be Monday following the Home Pom evaluations. UCA will select the 24 all-stars from the west and the same number from the east. These girls will perform at the AISA All-Star Football and Basketball games during the school year. Cheerleaders should **not** try out if they are not willing to **commit to both all-star events**. **Schools will be charged the regular fee for all-star cheerleaders who do not perform at the all-star football game. Schools will be charged a \$500 fee for all-star cheerleaders who do not perform at the all-star basketball game. (See enclosure)**

All-Star Cheerleader Qualification Criteria:

- a. Must be a senior in a member school and attend the AISA sponsored cheerleader clinic.
- b. Must be recommended by your cheerleader coach.
- c. Must be skilled in basic cheerleading stunts.
