4 Relating to K-12 school sports; to create the Tyrell 5 Spencer Act; to require coaches to undergo training and follow 6 all health and safety quidelines related to sudden cardiac 7 arrest; to require the training to be coordinated with 8 existing training requirements related to CPR and automated 9 external defibrillators (AEDs); to require the State Board of Education to approve training requirements and adopt 10 11 quidelines and information sheets regarding sudden cardiac 12 arrest and distribute those information sheets to student 13 athletes, parents, and coaches; to authorize the Alabama High 14 School Athletic Association and the Alabama Independent School Association to provide the training; to allow for the removal 15 from play of student athletes who exhibit symptoms of sudden 16 17 cardiac arrest; to require student athletes and parents to 18 acknowledge receipt of informational materials related to 19 sudden cardiac arrest; and to encourage AED availability.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the Tyrell Spencer Act.

Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the following terms have the following meanings:

- 25 (1) AHSAA. The Alabama High School Athletic
- 26 Association.
- 27 (2) AISA. The Alabama Independent School Association.
- 28 (3) ATHLETIC ACTIVITY.



- a. This term includes any of the following activities:
- Interscholastic athletics at any school.
- 2. Any athletic contest or competition other than
  interscholastic athletics that is sponsored by or associated
  with a school, including club-sponsored sports activities.
- 34 3. Competitive or noncompetitive cheerleading that is sponsored by or associated with a school.
- 4. Any practices, including interscholastic practices or scrimmages for any activities listed in this subdivision.
- 38 b. This term does not include any recreational sports
  39 activity that is not associated with a school, including a
  40 city or county recreational youth sports league.
- 41 (4) BOARD. The State Board of Education.

- Section 3. (a) The board shall adopt guidelines to inform and educate student athletes, parents, and coaches about the nature and warning signs of sudden cardiac arrest, including the risks associated with continuing to participate in or practice an athletic activity after experiencing
  - (b) The board shall develop a cardiac arrest symptoms and warning signs information sheet to be provided to each student athlete participating in an athletic activity.


    Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, before any student athlete may participate in any athletic activity, the student athlete and his or her parent or guardian shall sign and

	(c) In developing guidelines and materials, the board
	may use educational materials created by Simon's Heart for the
	purpose of educating student athletes, parents, and coaches
	about sudden cardiac arrest.
	(d) The board, the AHSAA, and the AISA shall post any
	guidelines or materials developed pursuant to this act on the
	publicly accessible website of the entity.
	Section 4. Each local board of education may hold an
	informational meeting for student athletes, parents, coaches,
	and other school officials prior to the start of each athletic
	season regarding the symptoms and warning signs of sudden
	cardiac arrest. Informational meetings may include, but are
	not limited to, presentations from physicians, pediatric
	cardiologists, and athletic trainers.
	Section 5. (a)(1) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school
	year, once every two years, each coach of any athletic
	activity shall complete a cardiac arrest training course
	provided by the AHSAA for its member schools and by the AISA

- (2) The training shall be in correlation with any other training required by the relevant school association related to cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automated external
- 92 defibrillators (AEDs).
- 93 (b) A coach of any athletic activity may not be
- 94 eligible to coach in any practice or competition until he or
- 95 she has completed the training course required under this
- 96 section.
- 97 Section 6. (a) An athletic trainer, coach, or other
- 98 responsible party may remove any student athlete who, during
- 99 any athletic activity, exhibits any symptoms identifiable by
- 100 the required training if the trainer, coach, or other
- 101 responsible party reasonably believes that the student
- 102 athlete's symptoms are cardiac related. If a student athlete
- 103 is removed from an athletic activity for the reason described
- 104 in this subsection, an athletic trainer, coach, or other
- 105 responsible party who observed the student athlete exhibit the
- 106 symptoms shall attempt to notify the student athlete's parent
- 107 or guardian of those symptoms.
- 108 (b) A student athlete who is removed from participation
- 109 in an athletic activity pursuant to this section may not be
- permitted to return to play until he or she has been evaluated
- 111 by a licensed physician and receives written clearance to
- 112 return to play from the licensed physician.





113	Section 7. The sponsors of recreational youth athletic
114	activities are encouraged, but not required, to follow the
115	guidelines provided in this act.
116	Section 8. The Legislature encourages the availability
117	of an automated external defibrillator (AED) within three
118	minutes retrieval time at any athletic activity.
119	Section 9. This act shall become effective on the first
120	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
121	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
